# Regulations

The General Studies Courses are a University requirement that must be satisfied before a student can be awarded his/her degree. The regulations approved by Senate are as follows:

# 1. Graduation Requirements

All students must take and pass the under listed Ges courses totaling (16 units), before graduation:

- (a) GES 101 Use of English I;
- (b) GES 107 Reproductive Health, Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs),
  Drugs and Mankind;
- (c) GES 106 Philosophy, Logic and Critical Thinking;
- (d) GES 108 Introduction to French;
- (e) GES 201 Use of English II;
- (f) GES 301 Introduction to Entrepreneurial Skill and
- (g) Two other courses as applicable to various Faculties shown in Table 1

### 2. GUIDELINES FOR REGISTRATION OF GES COURSES

- (a) Students shall register for General Studies Courses along with their departmental courses on-line on the University portal.
- (b) Students admitted through UTME should note the following:
  - In the first year, students must register three GES courses (i.e. GES 101, GES 107 and GES 108).
  - In the second year, GES 201 and GES 106 are compulsory for all students. In addition, science-based students should register either GES 102 or GES 103 while humanity-based students should register either GES 104 or GES 105.
  - In the third year, GES 301 is compulsory for all. Science-based students must register either GES 102 or GES 103, while humanity-based students should register either GES 104 or GES 105 in addition.
- (c) Students admitted through Direct Entry (DE) should note the following:

- Register four (4) GES courses in a session (i.e. GES 101, GES 107 and GES 108). In addition, science-based students should register either GES 102 or GES 103, while humanity-based students register either GES 104 or GES 105 for humanity-based students.
- In the second year, GES 201, GES 106 and GES 301 are compulsory for all students, science-based students must register either GES 102 or GES 103, while humanity-based students should register either GES 104 or GES 105 in addition.

Tables 3 below shows the courses open to students at different levels and semesters for UTME/DE

- (d) Students shall normally complete their GES courses by the end of their penultimate year in the University (i.e. the session preceding their year of graduation). Medical students shall normally complete their GES courses during their pre-clinical years.
- (e) All complaints about the timetable, as well as lecture venues should be referred to the Sub-Dean of each Faculty.

Faculties are expected to advise their students very well on the GES courses that will help achieve the objectives of the Centre.

The effective date shall be 2021/2022 academic session.

#### Note:

- (i). At the allotted times on the Faculty timetables, students for each GES Courses are advised to assemble at the venue(s) assigned for the course, where the course tutor(s) conduct the lectures and/or tutorials.
- (ii) To minimize the chances of timetable clashes, GES courses are slated for evening hours and Saturdays.

## 4. Examinations

Examinations of GES courses are usually taken at the end of the semester in which the courses are taught. For logistic reasons, GES courses are examined two weeks before examinations in all Faculties and the College of Medicine.

### **CONDUCT DURING GES EXAMINATIONS**

- 1. A student will only be allowed into the examination hall by producing the on-line registration course form.
- 2. All students shall queue up outside the examination hall, 30 minutes before the examination.
- 3. All defaulters will be sent back to the CGS office for clearance as all genuine cases will be handled by the office.
- 4. Students shall be called in and seated according to the 'Attendance List' because the exam questions have been arranged as such.

- 5. Each student must sign the 'Attendance List' as he/she collects the question paper and answer sheets, and must also sign out after the question paper and answer sheets are collected from him/her.
- 6. All question papers are customized for each registered candidate i.e. each page of question paper bears the name, registration number, Department, level and other information of the candidate.
- 7. All answer sheets are also customized for each registered candidate as in 1 above.
- 8. Without registration, there will be no question paper and answer sheet for any candidate.

  NO REGISTRATION, NO GES EXAMINATION
- 9. While answering the questions, students are expected to use HB pencil only to shade the correct answers on the answer sheets.
- 10. Invigilators shall demonstrate to students on how to tear the edges of the answer sheets and students should do so before the commencement of the examination.
  Only the OMR sheets that have perforated edges should be removed. Those OMR sheets without perforated edges should not be tempered with. Students who tear the edges wrongly should report immediately. Not tearing the edges correctly will lead to no result.
- 11. No student is allowed to throw anything out of the window or the door.
- 12. No interaction with anybody in any form. There should be no exchange of questions papers and answer sheets.
- 13. No handset or any mobile device is allowed into the examination hall.
- 14. Students must submit both the question papers and answer sheets and Students should not tamper with (pierce, tear, squeeze, staple or clip) the answer sheets. Failure to submit both question paper and answer sheet together will lead to no result.
- 15. All offences by students will be properly reported and channeled through the Students Disciplinary Committee.

All GES examination results are released at the end of the semester in which the courses are examined. All complaints relating to examination results must be made through the Sub-Dean, within six weeks of release.
